Did you Know:

Pickleball like most racquet sports relies on the integrity of the players in calling shots in or out. The rule of etiquette suggests that players will call the lines as honestly and fairly as they can. Players should call the lines on their side of the net and opponents will do the same on their side. Opponents should never make a call on the other side of the net unless they are asked. If a team cannot decide on a line call, then the benefit always goes to the opponent. If a team asks for an opinion from an opponent, that decision is final. Again, fairness is the rule of the day. Remember it is only a game. Keeping this in mind will prevent conflict on the court.

Hot Topic

Pickleball's Eye-Opening Problem

Pickleball's explosive rise has brought with it an unexpected downside: a sharp increase in eye injuries. A new JAMA Ophthalmology study finds that as the sport's U.S. player base surged to nearly 20 million by 2024, eye injuries have spiked, especially over the past four years.

Between 2014 and 2024, researchers estimated roughly 3,100 pickleball-related eye injuries, with about 1,262 cases in 2024 alone. Most injuries affected players over 50, and while many were minor (like eyelid cuts or corneal abrasions), some were serious, retinal detachments, orbital fractures, and internal eye bleeding.

The main culprit? Fast-moving balls and paddles. Modern equipment can send shots flying up to 60 mph, and with players standing just 14 feet apart at the kitchen line, there's little time to react.

Despite the growing data, protective eyewear isn't required at any level of play. USA Pickleball even voted down a rule change that would have made goggles mandatory in tournaments earlier this year.

Experts are now urging awareness and stronger safety guidelines. As one researcher put it: "We've seen a lot more new players unfamiliar with the sport, and that creates a lot of opportunity for injury."

So, is pickleball on the same path as skiing, where helmets eventually became standard? The answer may depend on how quickly players, and the sport itself, decide to open their eyes.
